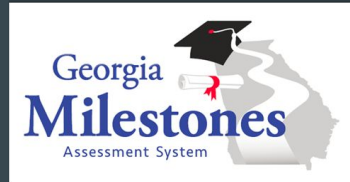

What is the Georgia Milestones Assessment?

The Georgia Milestones Assessment System (Georgia Milestones) is a comprehensive assessment program spanning grades 3 through high school.

Georgia Milestones measures how well students have learned the knowledge and skills outlined in the state-adopted content standards in language arts, math, science, and social studies.

Students in grades 3-8 will take an End-of-Grade (EOG) assessment in English Language Arts and Mathematics, while 5th & 8th will also take tests in Science and Social Studies.



What is the purpose of Georgia Milestones?

Georgia Milestones is designed to provide information about how well our students are mastering the state-adopted standards in the core content areas - English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies.

More importantly, Georgia Milestones is designed to provide students with information about their own achievement and readiness for their next level of learning.



What are the benefits of Georgia Milestones?

- The assessment allows students to show their work and explain their reasoning so teachers can better understand what they know and where there are gaps in learning that need to be addressed.
 - Rather than focusing on what a child has memorized through multiple choice questions, the tests ask students to apply skills like thinking, reasoning and justifying answers— showing what they know and can do.
 - The tests do not lend themselves to “teaching to the test.” Since they focus on applying skills, it is the daily practice of these skills in the classroom that will serve as the best preparation for the tests.
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When will our students take Georgia Milestones?

April 22 - April 25, 2024

April 22 - English Language Arts 1

April 23 - English Language Arts 2

April 24 - Mathematics

April 25 - Science (5th grade only)



What types of questions will our students see on the Georgia Milestones assessment?

- Open - ended (constructed-response) items in English Language Arts and Mathematics
- A writing component (in response to passages read) in the English Language Arts assessment
- Multiple-choice items

The assessment will be administered online.

Special accommodations can be made for students who cannot interact with a computer or device due to their disability.



How is Georgia Milestones Assessment scored?

Interpreting your child's score

Georgia Milestones measures how well a student has acquired the knowledge and skills outlined in the standards for their grade level.

Students are not compared to each other but are measured on how well they are meeting the standards.

Student achievement in each content area is classified into four performance levels called Achievement Levels.

Scores are scaled so that they are comparable and carry the same meaning to all stakeholders (Georgia, school systems, schools, teachers, parents, etc.)

A range of scaled scores will fall into one for four Achievement Levels.

Defining Achievement Levels

Achievement Level Score	Achievement Level Category	Achievement Level Description
1	Beginning Learner	not yet demonstrating proficiency in the knowledge and skills necessary at this grade level and content area of learning, as specified in Georgia's content standards. The students need substantial academic support to be prepared for the next grade level and to be on track for college and career readiness.
2	Developing Learner	demonstrating partial proficiency in the knowledge and skills necessary at this grade level and content area of learning, as specified in Georgia's content standards. The students need additional academic support to ensure success in the next grade level and to be on track for college and career readiness.
3	Proficient Learner	demonstrating proficiency in the knowledge and skills necessary at this grade level and content area of learning, as specified in Georgia's content standards. The students are prepared for the next grade level and are on track for college and career readiness.
4	Distinguished Learner	demonstrating advanced proficiency in the knowledge and skills necessary at this grade level and content area of learning, as specified in Georgia's content standards. The students are well prepared for the next grade level and are well prepared for college and career readiness.

What are our GES School Goals for Student Learning on the GA Milestones?

School Goals for 2023-2024

- By May 2024 the percentage of students in 4th grade performing at a level 3 or 4 in Math will increase from 41% (3rd-grade score) to 45% (4th-grade score) on the Georgia Milestones test.
- By May 2024 the percentage of students in 5th grade performing at a level 3 or 4 in Math will increase from 61% (4th-grade score) to 65% (on 5th-grade score) on the Georgia Milestones Assessment.
- By May 2024 the percentage of students in 4th grade performing a level 3 ro 4 in English Language Arts will increase from 40% (3rd grade score) to 43% (4th grade score) on the Georgia Milestones Assessment.
- By May 2024 the percentage of students in 5th grade performing at a level 3 or 4 in English Language Arts will increase from 40% (4th grade score) to 43% (5th grade score) on the Georgia Milestones Assessment.

We establish our school goals for student learning each year at Woodstation. Our students and staff work hard all year to achieve these goals! Our goals are included in our Parent & Family Engagement Policy and our School-wide Improvement Plan.

How can parents help our students prepare?

Students who are prepared, calm, and rested perform better on tests!

- **Encourage** your child to do their best and to use good test-taking skills, such as following directions carefully, avoiding careless errors, and reviewing their answers.
 - **Explain** to your child that the purpose of this test is to show what they have learned in school. Point out that some items may be more difficult than others, but that they should not get discouraged.
 - **Provide** your child opportunities to get plenty of sleep and have a healthy breakfast and lunch.
 - **Arrive** at school on time. Arriving on time ensures that your child is not rushed
 - **Appreciate** your child's hard work. Remember to ask your child about the test at the end of each day.

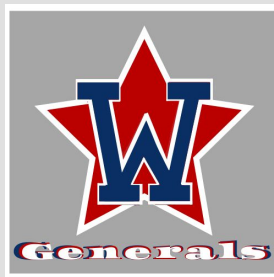
